You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type: The product is a non-cellular company limited by shares with an unlimited life, incorporated under the

Companies (Guernsey) Law, 2008, as amended (the "Guernsey Companies Law") on 30 December 2014 and is listed on the London Stock Exchange Main Market. As such, there is no maturity date. Shares of the PRIIP are bought and sold via markets. Typically, at any given time on any given day, the price at which an ordinary share can be bought will be higher than the price at which an ordinary share can be sold, brokers may additionally charge commissions. The product has borrowed to purchase assets for the company. This will

magnify any gains or losses made by the company.

Objectives: The product's investment objectives are to provide investors with regular, sustained, long-term distributions

and capital appreciation from a diversified portfolio of senior and subordinated economic infrastructure debt

Typical investors in the product are expected to be institutional, sophisticated investors, private clients through investor: their wealth managers, experienced investors, high net worth investors, professionally advised investors and

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



This risk indicator assumes you keep the product for at least 5 years (the 'recommended minimum holding period'). The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-high level and poor market conditions will likely impact the amount you get back.

Investment performance information

The main drivers of the Fund's performance will be the investment manager's degree of success in underwriting and structuring private loans to infrastructure projects in developed markets, the market value of those investments and their ability to generate interest income for the Fund. That level of interest income will depend upon interest rates over time in the jurisdictions that the Fund operates, and the credit quality of the loans that the Fund makes.

As the Fund invests across different global regions, the return can also be affected by the macro-economic factors affecting those economies.

This product does not track or compare itself to an index, benchmark, target or proxy. However, if you hold the product through an investment adviser/ investment manager, that person may set an appropriate benchmark against which you could compare its performance.

What could affect my return positively?

Higher returns can be expected when the income generated by the Fund's investment portfolio grows, or the value of its investments increases. This may be driven by a wide range of positive macro-economic factors, especially those pertaining to the geographies of the underlying investments, such as strong and stable real economic growth. Since the Fund holds a portfolio of loans, higher interest rates will over time increase the ability of the Fund to generate higher returns, although rapidly increasing interest rates may adversely affect the value of its investments in the short term.

What could affect my return negatively?

Lower returns can be expected when the income generated by the Fund's investment portfolio falls, or the value of its investments declines. This may be driven by a wide range of negative macro-economic factors, especially those pertaining to the geographies of the underlying investments, such as declining or negative economic growth. Returns may also be negatively affected by credit losses arising on its lending book. Since the Fund holds a portfolio of loans, lower interest rates will over time lead to the Fund generating lower returns.

Under adverse market conditions, an investor could suffer significant and prolonged, or even permanent, loss of capital. The maximum possible loss is 100% of the money invested in the Company. There is no minimum guaranteed level of capital to be returned.

3. What happens if the manufacturer is unable to pay out?

The value of the shares in the PRIIP is directly impacted by the solvency status of Sequoia Economic Infrastructure Income Fund. No service provider to the product has any obligation to make any payment to you in respect of the Ordinary Shares. There are no investor compensation or guarantee scheme available to investors should the product be unable to pay out, you should be prepared to assume the risk that you could lose all of your investment.

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, on-going and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. The figures assume you invest GBP 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.
